- In 2019, Vanuatu was experiencing its fastest ever growth in international arrivals and the citizens and businesses of Vanuatu were thriving. All sectors of the economy, in particular Vanuatu's vibrant tourism industry, were reaping the rewards of this free movement and connectivity.
- The COVID-19 pandemic and the closure of borders was a tremendous blow to every country's aviation sector, people and economy.
 - However, no region in the world was more affected than the Pacific.
 International arrivals to the Pacific fell by a staggering 95% in 2021 compared to pre-COVID levels.
- Vanuatu too.
 - Your tourism industry was forced to adapt, people-to-people links were halted and businesses suffered.
- But Vanuatu is resilient.
- Since Vanuatu's borders were reopened in mid-2022, we have seen a gradual resumption of connectivity. Business travellers and tourists are returning.
- Virgin Australia's arrival back into Vanuatu marks the next phase in this recovery.
 - Your return represents a significant boost to Vanuatu's connectivity and is a substantial increase in the number of people that are able to fly into Vanuatu for work, relaxation or ecotourism/adventure.
