## Jane Joshua and Jenny Nierre win 2018 International Women's Day awards

The winners of the 2018 International Women's Day awards are journalist and editor, Jane Joshua, from Malekula and teacher, Jenny Nierre from Tanna.

Jane Joshua was awarded the 2018 Hanson Mataskelekele - Women in Leadership Award for her outstanding role as an active senior journalist in Vanuatu. Jane has extensively covered important development issues in Vanuatu, including stories that made the international news. Recently, Jane was promoted to Chief Editor at the Vanuatu Daily Post.

Jenny Nierre was awarded the 2018 Andy Lynch – Excellence in Community Sector Award for her passion, determination and commitment to teaching despite having no formal training. Jenny is a self-determined person and is committed to providing the children of Lamnatou community in Tanna an education. Her commitment to implement Vanuatu's new education curriculum won her recognition as one of the country's high performing teachers.

Each year, to celebrate International Women's Day in Vanuatu, the Australian Government presents the Andy Lynch Award and the Hanson Mataskelekele Award to two ni-Vanuatu women to recognise their contributions to the community in the fields of leadership and excellence in the community sector.

These national Awards are funded by the Australian Government and are a joint initiative of the Lynch and Mataskelekele families and the Australian High Commission.
